In choosing how to make your bequest, please give thought to these options:

CONTINGENT BEQUEST

Bequeaths your estate absolutely to a person or persons, but if they predecease you, your estate is bequeathed to the Curtin University Foundation.

PERCENTAGE BEQUEST

Specifies a percentage of your estate to the Curtin University Foundation.

RESIDUAL BEQUEST

Bequeaths the remainder of your estate (the residue) after debts, charges and gifts have been deducted. A residual bequest maintains its relative value, automatically adjusting with the value of your estate.

SPECIFIC BEQUEST

Bequeaths an asset other than money; for example, property, books, paintings and shares.

PECUNIARY BEQUEST

Bequeaths a fixed amount of money.

HOW TO INCLUDE A BEQUEST IN YOUR WILL

When preparing your Will, we recommend that you seek legal advice to ensure your wishes are expressed correctly.
